STOP the MBTA Attacks on Seniors & People with Disabilities

The MBTA is facing a \$161 million dollar deficit and has proposed <u>severe service cuts & fare increases</u> to close the gap - <u>targeting seniors, people with disabilities, and students for the most extreme fare increases</u>. The primary cause of the deficit is a large debt passed onto the MBTA by the Big Dig, not seniors and people with disabilities. Stop the attacks!

Together we say

NO Disproportionate Fare Increases! (see reverse side)

The MBTA has proposed general fare increase of 35%-43%. However, they have targeted students for fare increases of 76% - 100%, and Seniors and People with Disabilities for fare increases of 83% -500%!



NO Service Cuts!

The MBTA has proposed elimination of up to 101 bus lines, ferry service, many of the local "people carriers", and an end to weekend service on the E Line, Mattapan trolley, & Commuter rail. This would harm economic development, cut off service for many hospitals and senior housing developments, and cause disproportionate hardship for many low and moderate income families and individuals who rely on the MBTA to get to work, school, etc.

NO "Premium Service" for the Ride!

The MBTA has proposed a new "premium service" for the Ride for anyone who lives or needs to travel more than ¾ of a mile from a bus or train, change their pick up time, or schedule a same day trip. Thousands of seniors and people with disabilities will face a \$24 roundtrip-500% increase for this service. We reject any redefinition of the ADA service area.

YES Real Revenue Solutions!

Legislators and the Governor must act with real revenue solutions to preserve the MBTA service and stop the unfair targeting of those who can afford it least.
