

## How You Can Influence a Bill at Every Stage in the Law Making Process

Contact the Governor to express your view	Contact your Senator or Representative asking them to vote the way you want when the bill comes to the floor for a vote  Urge bill sponsors to ask leadership for support	Ask the committee members to write, call, or visit the leadership	Contact the committee to express your opinion	Organize with other stakeholders to meet with committee members and staff	Contact your Senator or Representative asking them to urge the co-chairs of the committee to release the bill	Attend the Executive Session to show your support (you cannot speak at the executive session)	Follow up with committee staff to provide any additional information	Contact your Senator or Representative to ask them to convey your concerns to the Committee Chairs	Submit written testimony to the members of the Joint Committee	Testify on the bill on the day of the hearing	Contact your Senator or Representative to inform them of the bill and ask for their support	Then You Can:
